## February's Speaker on Conservation

Our speaker for February will be Marie Cefalo, currently Water Resources Outreach Supervisor for the Town of Cary.

Marie provides Water Resources Outreach Supervision, which includes overseeing the Town's nationally recognized water conservation program as well as stormwater outreach and overall water communications.

She will speak on Cary's Water Conservation Program, its intention, structure, successes, and opportunities. She will share with the Club some of the exciting highlights of this important program.

Marie was employed with Town of Cary when their water conservation program was new. She designed and delivered water conservation lessons to thousands of school children, developed water conservation campaigns, and later oversaw the daily operations and

long-term water conservation initiatives of the water conservation program.



She was awarded the Governor's Conservation Award for the Municipal Conservationist of the Year from the NC Wildlife Federation in 2004. She also received the Vocational Service Award from the Cary-Kildaire Rotary Club in 2009.

She holds a Bachelor's degree from Davidson College and a Master's degree from UNC-Chapel Hill.
