## Education CSP



I hope you were able to attend HerbFest at the Page-Walker grounds on Saturday, May 7<sup>th</sup>. Visitors strolled the grounds and toured the Herb gardens. They visited booths selling herbs, crafts and garden products. Fun for all ages!



Returning this year were the popular butterfly releases. There were volunteers at the Herb garden to answer questions as well as volunteers at our new Pollinator garden to encourage citizens to plant their own Pollinator garden.

We had a brand new Pollinator Garden brochure that debuted at this event, with our Cary Woman's Club credit on the back cover. Some of our CWC members volunteered at the event.
