Monthly Newsletter

The Cary Woman's Club provides ongoing communication directly through emails from our various CSP Chairs and a monthly newsletter which typically comes out on the first of the month, before our regular general membership meeting. The newsletter helps all our members to know what is going on in our club and how they can participate in our programs, fundraising and activities. The officers and committee chairpersons as well as individual members submit information that they would like to have published.

The newsletter editor sends special edition/interim communications as reminders of events and donation drives. Upon request, she will create a beautifully designed invitation for CSP chairs or other members to notify and/or invite members to a scheduled event or program. Newsletters are also available on the website and copies are sent to prospective members (in lieu of a membership brochure) to encourage them

to see how active the club members are in providing programs to improve the community. We believe this method is more current and more cost effective than a brochure. Each newsletter includes an item about GFWC or GFWC-NC or the state President's Special Project.

Yearbook

Each year the club reviews and updates the yearbook which provides a comprehensive reference for club members. A new club member receives a physical binder with updated information, but current members receive updates via email each year which they can then use to update their binders. Yearbooks have six sections:

- Administration includes mission statement, officers, trustees, club address, meeting information, hosting procedure and words of the pledge of allegiance, salute to NC flag and Collect for Club Women
- 2. GFWC / GFWC-NC / GFWC-NC District IV information which includes names, addresses and calendar of events
- 3. Community Service Programs lists Community Service Programs and current Chairs, other committees and members
- 4. Financial provides financial statements and current club budget
- 5. Membership Directory names and contact information for current members and a list of Past-Presidents of the Cary Woman's Club.
- 6. Policies and Procedures and Bylaws

Not only is our Yearbook a reference source of information, but also a place to file minutes, communications and project information throughout the year. The Yearbook also serves as an archive of the year.
