### Remembering Barb Sawyer - Clubwoman with Heart

Barb Sawyer passed away on March 31, 2023, after a courageous battle with pancreatic cancer. She wasn't one to complain and she fought the disease until the very end.

Barb was a dual member of The Woman's Club of Raleigh and the Cary Woman's Club. She had joined the WCR in 1988 and had held many positions there like leading Great Decisions lecture series. She had been involved in numerous CSP projects and fundraising. Several years ago when the WCR needed a treasurer, Barb stepped in as acting treasurer (no small task) until the position was filled, and she had been recently been serving as Trustee. She had

helped to create a Juniorette Club and was also involved in the Young Women of Achievement in our high schools. She had been nominated by the WCR and she received the Clubwoman with Heart Award at a past GFWC-NC convention.

Barb had also been a past president of the Cary Woman's Club, having joined the Cary Woman's Club in 2005. Recently she served as co-chair of the Arts & Culture CSP. She loved leading rock painting workshops that went on display at the Page-Walker

garden. Even though she was not feeling well, she still took the time to create favors for the Christmas luncheon.

One of her favorite programs in District 6 was the Chrysalis Club, and she had been the chairman of that program for a number of years. She thoroughly enjoyed being with the women from the NC Correctional Institution for Women and organizing visits for all of the clubs in our district.



She also loved her involvement in the Triangle Purple Heart and the Gold Star Family organizations and was responsible for helping to plan and coordinate the large dinners supporting our veterans and their families.

Barb so loved the arts and was incredibly creative, and she even had a special crafts room in her home. She kept up with many in the arts community, and you were very fortunate if you ever received one of her beautiful hand-made cards. She was also an avid bridge player and a member of several bridge groups.



### **Heritage Daffodil Rescue Project**

As you have heard, the Cary Woman's Club has been given permission to rescue 800 or more Heritage Daffodils on an old homestead due to the construction of the 540 Bypass at the intersection of Kildaire Farm Rd. and Holly Springs Rd.

The daffodils are now ready to be dug, cleaned and packaged for fall planting over the next month. We plan to plant some in public gardens in Cary and sell some of the bulbs at the Glenaire Craft Fair on Nov. 18, 2023.

Most of our work must be done on Sundays due to active construction nearby. We have engaged local high school boys to do the actual digging but will need lots of Woman's Club members to help with the cleaning, sorting, packaging, and labeling with planting directions over several days. Some of these jobs are sit-down jobs. None of our jobs require excess strength or special knowledge or talent!
