



#### **Environment**

Thank you to all who made our October Program "Toward Zero Waste" presenters feel so welcome as we learned some ways to do our part to reduce waste!

Daffodil rescue from an old homestead South of Cary where I 540 passes by Holly Springs and Kildare Farm Roads is underway. Last Sunday, October 21, 2023, we worked to dig and harvest about 500 daffodil bulbs in an overgrown home site now in a construction zone. It was a joint effort with a few CWC and Cary Garden Club members, three students from Holly

Springs High School and the sponsor of the Cary High School Environmental Club. About 500 bulbs were dug that afternoon then cleaned and trimmed at the Page Walker, October 23, 2023, with the help of many additional hands. The bulbs are now drying to be bagged and sold at the upcoming Craft Fair, Nov 4, 2023, with profits to benefit our community programs. Many dozen were also replanted on Monday, October 22, 2023 at the Page Walker pollinator garden. At that time, we harvested Ginger Lily rhizomes that were bagged for sale too.

#### Health and Wellness




We had a successful bingo at Total Life this month, and will be planning another one for November.
