Education CSP



September marks the end of summer and back to school for our grandkids (remember those

hectic mornings?). Oh my, I think I for one are glad they are in the rear view mirror, and, the start of another GFWC Cary Woman's Club season of giving back to our community through "time, talent, and treasure," as our logo depicts.

Our goal this year, as Education CSP Co-chairs, is to provide "boots on the ground" opportunities for our members to participate, all in the true spirit of GFWC's dedication to improving the communities in which we live.

We are partnering again this year with **Kingswood Elementary**, a Title I School, literally a half a mile from the Page-Walker to provide much needed volunteers to: "assist in kindergarten and first grade classrooms during their reading blocks (usually 9:15-10:00- any portion of that time).

What that looks like is an adult who either circulates and helps students with their independent work plans or sometimes listening to students read or tell about their work. Some volunteers come in to mentor children with special social and emotional needs. You would be surprised at what a difference that can make in the life of a child to have a person that they look forward to talking to or interacting with each week.

Another opportunity is to work with the media specialist in the library (shelving books, helping to check out books, or again, just circulating and helping students with their just right books). Some folks come in and help with cutting out, coloring, and pasting independent works for students," (continues on next page)

this fact, during the last three years, Note in the Pocket has clothed 1,873 Cary children, those are munchkins living at The Carying Place, and attending Kingswood Elementary! Documented need in our own backyard.

Finally, we are very pleased to announce, in conjunction with the Trustees, that we will have *two* **\$2,000 Scholarships** to award to a deserving High School student. The Scholarship Committee will be meeting to discuss the parameters, and commence forwarding the information to the various High School Counselors, in an effort to solicit more applicants this year.

We are considering, giving additional weight to any student planning to continue their education in the Early Childhood field, in keeping with the inspiring program we heard from our own member, **Anne Mackie**, regarding the critical importance of the "First 1,000 Days" of a new life, and the deplorable lack of certified preschool and daycare programs in NC. We invite your thoughts and comments.

Before you start thinking, WHEW, overwhelming ... remember, we are simply providing opportunities. By no means, are we asking you to signup for every event or donate to every cause.

But consider this, if we each brought one can of spaghetti sauce, we would have 34 to donate. If we each read to a child for an hour, there would be 34 hours of making a difference in a child's education. There is strength in numbers, and thus the reason we join a philanthropic organization.

We have an operating room nurse from *Operation Smile* scheduled to speak to us in February 2017. Remember Operation Smile? It's one of our GFWC CSP partners that provides free surgeries for children and young adults with cleft lip, cleft palate, and other facial deformities. To welcome her as our speaker in February, let's provide her a bevy of "necessities" these surgeries

require: hospital gowns, blankets, armbands, and "comfort" toys – items



sewn. If you can pin, cut, fold, iron, stuff, or even sew(!), you can participate in the making of these items *and* socialize while you work!

Did I mention \$240 funds the surgical procedure for one child? There's a way to provide this, and that's TBD!

While we're on the subject of Operation Smile, let's set up a display in our local library or adopted school

Public Issues: USO Campaign to Connect

I learned about this way to help the USO (United Service Organizations), benefitting U.S. troops and their families, at the State GFWC Workshop this summer. The USO is a GFWC partner organization in the Public Issues CSP.



The USO's Campaign to Connect, collects messages of support from citizens, and then sends them to service members via USO centers around the world. Their goal is to collect 1 million supportive messages this year.

According to the 2015 Blue Star Families (those families with active duty or National Guard service members) Military Lifestyle Survey, 90% of service members feel the American public

doesn't understand their sacrifice.

Help change that perception by sending a message of support today. It can be very short, such as "Have a Nice Day", or "Thinking of you", or "I appreciate you", or a much longer message.


