Conservation CSP – Taking a quick look back on 2017, and a look of anticipation at 2018

In 2017, the Conservation CSP volunteers contributed almost 200 hours in maintenance and education in the Page-Walker Pollinator Garden that is maintained in partnership with the Cary Garden Club and the Friends of the Page-Walker. And, our members spent a combined total of 105 hours on our educational trip to the mature and exemplary Pollinator Garden at Chatham Mills in Pittsboro, and were delighted by the enthusiasm of garden manager, Debbie Roos. The lunch at Oak Leaf restaurant was pretty special too! I'm glad we did this tour last year, as Oak Leaf has moved to a new location.

We also tried out **Flower Power**, but found that was not a suitable fundraiser for us, even though it sounded really good and easy. Not to be repeated!

We also distributed about 200 seed packets of Forget-Me-Not flowers to welcome our GFWC-NC counterparts to Cary for the GFWC State Convention in Cary, in celebration of **Federation Day on April 24**. And, we can repeat this activity again as the Convention will be in Cary for the second year in April 2018.

A couple of other opportunities for 2018 are to volunteer in the **Weatherstone Elementary Edible Garden**, which won one of our CWC grants. We also have submitted an application to

claim an **Adopt-a-Spot** in front of the new Cary Library that is scheduled for construction in 2018. This is of special interest as the Cary Library was started by the Cary Woman's Club and the Cary Junior Woman's Club in 1951. We are also interested in that little issue of naming the new library for Walter Hines Page, Cary's most famous native son!

And, meet Thistle, the newest member of the Cary Woman's Club!



Those who attended the January meeting of the Cary Woman's Club were introduced to our newest member, **Thistle**, **a grey mouse lemur** at the **Duke Lemur Center** in Durham. On behalf of the Cary Woman's Club, the Conservation CSP has adopted Thistle for the year.

The reason for the Lemur Center donation to adopt Thistle is to branch out a bit from the garden, and to offer a tour to the

Lemur Center (cute and engaging endangered species, and right in our backyard!) in the spring. Duke is doing research now on the grey mouse lemurs for Alzheimer's, as lemurs (prosimian primates) are our closest "relatives," and are some of the most endangered animals in the world. Duke also has researchers working with lemurs in their native Madagascar, an island off the east coast of Africa. More on the Alzheimer's research next month.

Thistle was born July 21, 2011 and weighed ¼ ounce, about the weight of 3 pennies! Her parents are Oleander and Pesto. Thistle is living by herself right now since she was having frequent spats with her former roomie, Bluebell. As an adult, Thistle weighs about 3 ounces, but she compensates for her tiny size with attitude! We think she'll make a great member of the CWC! She probably will complain about the snacks we provide at meetings, as her favorite food is mealworms, but we don't think our Social Committee should try to accommodate her tastes! Thistle also loves to leap from branch to branch in her room, so could probably not sit still for our meetings, or she might fall asleep during the meeting, as she is nocturnal. We guess we will just have to visit Thistle at Duke, rather than her visiting our meetings. Thistle will provide us with a little newsletter update about her life each month this year.


Our club is excited to host Chief Justice Martin on March 8! Please spread the word and bring guests!
