Arts

Our guest speaker this month will be Kenneth Neilsen, Master Potter. His shop is located at 106 Dry Avenue, Cary (919.462.0062). His presentation will be followed by our own Arts Fair. Don't forget the items you wish to submit!

The next day, Friday January 11, we will meet in front of "The Beyond: Georgia O'Keefe and Contemporary Art" at 9:50 AM at the NC Art Museum on Blue Ridge Road. Please be sure to get your exhibition tickets when you arrive, so we can be ready for our tour at 10 AM. Since the exhibit is closing January 20, the Museum is no longer providing docents. However, Susan Abbott, a long-time volunteer at the Museum, has agreed to take us around and provide commentary and the "inside-scoop" on the exhibit. Susan wants you to know that she is giving her own tour (not the official "docent" tour). We are very grateful that Susan is willing to share her knowledge with us! And her tour is free! The tour will be followed by lunch at the Iris located at the Museum.

Conservation

The garden volunteers "put the Pollinator Garden to bed" in November, but we left all the plants that were still blooming. As freezing weather encourages more plants to go dormant, we will continue cleaning up the stems and faded blooms through the winter.

We are leaving flower heads with seeds in the garden, so that the birds can enjoy them during the cold weather. You might consider doing the same thing in your home garden so that the birds can endure the cold weather.

The Conservation Dept. also plans to adopt-a-lemur again for the coming year, and we will have news about that adoption at the January meeting. I'll also bring an update on Thistle, our 2018 adoptee.

National GFWC is asking us to plant trees in our communities, with a goal of 1000 trees nationwide. That should be an easy goal to achieve. Where should we plant trees in Cary? I'll be asking for ideas at the January meeting, because February and March are the best planting times in NC. One recent study has revealed that Cary is losing 400 acres of tree canopy a year due to development. What can we do to help mitigate that loss? If that pace continues, we will have no tree canopy left in 10 years. What do we want Cary to look like in 10 years? Let's start now to do our part and set an example for others.

I encourage you to enter some conservation themed photos or essays or poems in the January Arts Festival.
