Conservation

National GFWC is asking us to plant trees in our communities, with a goal of 1000 trees nationwide. That should be an easy goal to achieve. Where should we plant trees in Cary? I'll be asking for ideas at the March meeting, because late fall, February and March are the best planting times in NC. So we need to plan for next year and, of course, we will coordinate with the Town of Cary. The Town has a grant program for community gardens, tree planting, and environmental restoration. One recent study has revealed that Cary is losing 400 acres of tree canopy a year due to development. I agree with Dr. Seuss that "sometimes I think that progress progresses too fast!" What can we do to help mitigate that loss? If that pace continues, we will have no tree canopy left in 10 years. What do we want Cary to look like in 10 years? Let's start now to do our part and set an example for others. We can be the Lorax to "speak for the trees!"

The good news is that our Pollinator Garden efforts have spurred a wider effort, and the Mayor signed a Proclamation in February declaring that 2019 is the Year of the Monarch Butterfly in Cary. Link to article on Town of Cary website.
