The Cary Woman's Club had several *"Top Club Projects"* (the finalists for each award):

- Arts and Culture for Susan Abbott's design of our Centennial Celebration 1920-2020/Voting Matters yard signs
- Education and Libraries for our virtual clothing drive for Note in the Pocket
- Health and Wellness for their Bingo parties at Chatham Commons Nursing Home
- **Fundraising** for the Pocket Tree/Cary Gifting Tree fundraiser which raised \$2177.25 for Note in the Pocket

## We also won first place for the following CSP's:

- Domestic and Sexual Violence Awareness and Prevention for our donation of \$2,125 to
  InterAct which included gift cards as well as cash contributions (including the money donated by
