CWC and Cary Garden Club volunteers have been working individually and in small groups to complete basic Spring cleanup of the garden. My 16year old grandson, Caron, also helped for two days with the heavy lifting part (mulch and digging out huge weedy bushes, as he needed high school volunteer hours. Win-win!

# **Lemur Adoption**

Once again, we have adopted our tiniest member, **Thistle**, the Mouse Lemur through the Duke Lemur Center. Thistle and her friends continue to participate in non-invasive Alzheimer's Research at the Duke Lemur Center, and we receive quarterly updates on her activities. Hard to share them on Zoom, but I will bring photos and updates to the September meeting when we hope to meet in person!

### **Heifer Project**

Since GFWC nationally no longer has a separate CSP (Community Service Project) for International, our Environment CSP members decided to renew a previous commitment of the Cary Woman's Club to the Heifer International Project.

We have donated a sheep for \$120. The sheep, which will be given to a family, will provide wool to sell, or to construct clothing, and will also produce baby lambs, so that the family can grow their flock.

And we donated \$30 to provide bees and a hive to a family, along with training in beekeeping. The family can earn income through the sale of honey and beeswax, and the bees can help to double the fruit and vegetable yields in the community through pollination. In addition, hives divide annually so that more villagers can begin beekeeping, boosting the whole village. Each of the Environment co-chairs also donated a beehive and bees to this project.
