Board of Trustees

Lillian Smith chaired the Board of Trustees meeting on July 28 with Dan Thomason, Investment Officer at First Citizens Bank. *Maryanne Olsen* will serve as Vice-Chair and *Nell Meece* will be the Secretary of the Board of Trustees for this year. Other members of the Board of Trustees are *Jane Suppa* and *Karen Russell*. The treasurer (Diane Andersen) and the president (Karen Fiumara) were also present at this meeting.

The Board reviewed the **Maynard Fund** and the **Scholarship Fund**. The Maynard Fund supplies the \$1,500 for the Mature Woman's Scholarship. The interest from the Scholarship Fund (at this point, \$3,000) funds the other scholarships. The Board discussed withdrawing some money from the principal (as well as the interest) but decided to preserve the principal and "stay the course" for now (only using the interest) because of the uncertainty of this pandemic year. However, this topic will be revisited at our next meeting.

Thank you, Trustees, for your willingness to serve on this important Board that keeps a watchful eye on our investments.
