# **Growth of Cary Tree Archive - Rooted in the Work of More than 450 Volunteers**

On March 19, 2020, just hours before we experienced the meaning and consequences of the word COVID, members of the Cary Woman's Club and Cary Garden Club planted Longleaf pine tree seedlings at the Cary Tree Archive <a href="https://www.carytreearchive.org">www.carytreearchive.org</a> across Cary Parkway from the YMCA. Ours was the

7<sup>th</sup> volunteer planting at the Tree Archive, which has been followed by more than 30 plantings of a variety of trees and pollinator garden plants. The little tree seedlings were in the "grass stage" (meaning they looked like grass!) so we surrounded them with mulch and "tomato cages" to protect them. They are the beginning of a small Longleaf Pine Savannah, the native ecosystem that covered the Cary area prior to the arrival of the Page family and the founding of Cary. The seedlings are now two years old and are in the "candle" stage, a description of the white terminal bud of the tree as it grows. The Cary Tree Archive is a great place for a family visit and maybe even a picnic. Check it out!


