Welcome back to another year of reading, conversation and friendship. Our book this month is The Lincoln Highway by Amor Towles. https://www.amortowles.com/the-lincoln-highway-about-the-book/

A #1 New York Times Best Seller

In June, 1954, eighteen-year-old Emmett Watson is driven home to Nebraska by the warden of the juvenile work farm where he has just served fifteen months for involuntary manslaughter. His mother long gone, his father recently deceased, and the family farm foreclosed upon by the bank, Emmett's intention is to pick up his eight-year-old brother, Billy, and head to California where they can start their lives anew.

But when the warden drives away, Emmett discovers that two friends from the work farm—the wily, charismatic Duchess and earnest, offbeat Woolly—have stowed away in the trunk of the warden's car. Together, they have hatched an altogether different plan for Emmett's future, one that will take the four of them on a fateful journey in the opposite direction to the city of New York.

Spanning ten days and told from multiple points of view, <u>Towles</u>'s third novel is a multilayered tale of misadventure and self-discovery, populated by an eclectic cast of characters, from drifters who make their home riding the rails and larger-than-life vaudevillians to the aristocrats of the Upper East Side. An absorbing, exhilarating ride, The Lincoln Highway is a novel as vivid, sweeping, and moving as readers have come to expect from Towles's work.

Book Club this month is on **Thursday, September 22nd from 1pm to 2:30pm** at the home of Maryanne Olsen. Whether you come only once for a special book, or every month, every club member is welcome. This month's selection looks intimidating with over 500 pages but it is an entertaining and fast read.

We will be selecting books for future months and hope to have those titles by our first CWC general meeting. **We meet on the fourth Thursday of each month,** except for holiday months, from September through April (9/22, 10/27, 11/16, 12/14, 1/26, 2/23, 3/23 and 4/27).
