



GFWC-NC State President's Special Project, Mountains to Sea Trail

At the recent GFWC-NC District VI meeting, the Environment CSP group began planning a special event for the spring on the Mountains to Sea Trail. This will be a Mountains to Sea Trail Relay along the ~80+ miles of the Trail that winds through 3 of the 6 counties of District VI. The Trail goes across Durham, Wake, and Johnston counties, beginning on the west in Durham at Eno River State Park, then along the southern shore of Falls Lake through Wake County, then along the Neuse River through Blue Jay Point County Park, next to Annie Wilkerson Park, from Buffalo Rd. to Milburnie Park, then to Anderson Point Park, and follows the Neuse River into Johnston County to Clayton, Smithfield, and Bentonville Battlefield.

Each GFWC-NC club in District VI will be invited to select a 3-5 miles section of the trail where they would like to hike on the day/weekend of the Relay. Each club can hike at their own chosen time and at their own pace, and will be encouraged to take photos to share. Most of the trail in District VI is easy, some is even paved. There are plans for common signage where a club may add its name. T-shirts are also planned for the Relay with the GFWC-NC MST logo on the front and option to add club name on the back.

These plans are preliminary but will be fun to think about for a Spring 2023 event! Another discussion of the Environment committee was to challenge each club to plant at least one tree per member each of the next two years, as our effort to impact climate change. The best time to plant trees is fall: October-December.

Pecan Fundraising is here! Deadline for orders is Oct 14, 2022

Thank you to all of you who have already submitted your orders and checks for pecans! Keep the orders coming! Let's try to sell more this year and have a bigger profit for our club.

If you have tasted our pecans you know how good they are. Share the goodness with your family, friends, coworkers and neighbors. Order

plenty- a year's supply! They will stay fresh for months in your freezer. You cannot buy these fresh pecans at Costco or a grocery store. The order form will be sent with the newsletter. Feel free to copy the form or email it to your customers.

NUTS NOTE!

As you realize by now, it is the season when we kick off and complete our fall fundraiser, the Cary Woman's Club Pecan sale. An order form is attached to this newsletter, but we hope you have already distributed a lot of forms to your friends, family, neighbors and regular customers. We do have orders coming in now and payment is due with each order. The selections and the prices are the same as last year. We hope to increase our sales numbers now that we are able to make face-to-face contacts. We encourage every member to buy or sell at least one pound of pecans. They make great holiday gifts.

The deadline for orders to be submitted is Friday, Oct 14th, the day after our general meeting held at Blue Jay Point. You can bring completed orders and money with you to the meeting, but prefer that all orders be mailed, with payment to Mercedes Cooley at the address on the order form.

We expect the pecans to be delivered to Cary about mid-November, depending on the weather and when the pecans mature! Patience!! It takes 7-10 years for a pecan tree to mature and bear fruit (nuts). When the nuts are mature (sometime in October), they begin to fall from the trees, but the farmers also use a mechanical shaking machine to encourage the pecans to fall, without damaging the trees. Then the pecans are collected from the ground by a harvesting machine, and cleaned, shelled, sorted and some are dipped in chocolate, before they are delivered to us!

Once again, we appreciate the support of Terry's Floor Fashions in allowing us to have our pecans delivered to their dock at their warehouse. This saves us money and makes the truck driver happy! Our committee will spend a few hours at the warehouse putting the pecans in bags to match your orders and notify you of how to pick up or have orders delivered to you. We count on each member to arrange delivery of orders to your own customers.

Orders and payment will be due on October 14.

- Men's long sleeve dress shirts (S, M, L) which are worn to work as protection from sun and pesticides.
- Men's pants (greatest need is for waist sizes 32-36 and lengths 30/32).
- T-shirts and shorts for after work
- Baseball caps
- Bicycle style boxer shorts (new only) made with Lycra.
- Over the counter medications (like Ibuprofen) and vitamins. The clinic collects these to distribute to farm workers for the treatment of work-related conditions.

If you have any of these items, they can be dropped off at my house (204 Willesden Drive) or I will pick them up. Deadline is *September 30*.
