




As 2022 comes to an end, it is time to reflect on your year in the Cary Woman's Club and recall your contributions to community service. Please write down the **volunteer hours** you contributed to CWC activities and to the organizations that are doing the work of our club values. Form is attached to email.

Also make note and document the amount of **financial support** you gave these organizations, and the value of **in-kind support** such as donation of gift cards, toiletries, plants, household items, clothing, etc. Please include personal donations of time and money, even if they were not specifically CWC projects. For example, if you tutor students on your own, maintain public gardens, volunteer in schools or nursing homes, donate monthly to the USO, registered voters (nonpartisan) or encouraged people to vote (but NOT political contributions), or to educational or environmental organizations. All of these are within our programmatic goals, even though we do not do club-wide activities there. And they are within the state and national GFWC Resolutions and are supposed to be reported.

Please report these numbers to the appropriate CSP Chair, or to Lois Nixon (if you are not sure which category it fits into, but not to both to avoid duplication) no later than **January 8**, so that each CSP Chair can prepare the year end report draft, and we can submit it to the state by February 1, 2023!

I know that reporting is not anyone's favorite activity, but it is an important way to measure our community impact—and it will make you feel good to realize all you and we have accomplished! THANK YOU!

Our book club continues to be very popular with members and our December book is *The Last House on the Street*

From bestselling author Diane Chamberlain comes an irresistible new novel that perfectly interweaves history, mystery, and social justice.

When Kayla Carter's husband dies in an accident while building their dream house, she knows she has to stay strong for their four-year-old daughter. But the trophy home in Shadow Ridge Estates, a new development in sleepy Round Hill, North Carolina, will always hold tragic memories. But when she is confronted by an odd, older woman telling her not to move in, she almost agrees. It's clear this woman has some kind of connection to the area...and a connection to Kayla herself. Kayla's elderly

new neighbor, Ellie Hockley, is more welcoming, but it's clear she, too, has secrets that stretch back almost fifty years. Is Ellie on a quest to right the wrongs of the past? And does the house at the end of the street hold the key? Told in dual time periods, The Last House on the Street is a novel of shocking prejudice and violence, forbidden love, the search for justice, and the tangled vines of two families.
