We hope that members will support the Read & Feed Book Drive that we will be having at the February 9th General Meeting. You will recall that in November Sherry Shudra, Executive


Director of Read & Feed, spoke to us about the wonderful work that the organization has been providing to children of Wake County. We would like to support this organization by providing:
